Hi , I am Shelly, I am a true Yorkshire lass, born and bred, with an immense love and appreciation of life, especially in rural areas, where I can not only be close to my beloved nature and wildlife, but also enjoy becoming involved with Village communities, who are, in my experience, always warm, welcoming, with hearts of gold! I am especially thrilled to be back in the Parish of South Cave, Ellerker and Broomfleet, working as Assistant Curate! It is such an enormous honour to be given this amazing opportunity to work with such wonderful people in such a beautiful setting!

Up until recently I have worked for many years in cities, especially in deprived areas, with children and young people. My work in Education spans over 30 years as a qualified Teacher, Youth Worker and Chaplain. I see such great need for youngsters of today to be nurtured and supported throughout their lives. In a world filled with so many challenges, I have appreciated and treasured the chance to engage with young ones who have had particularly difficult, traumatic lives. I pray that in the years I have worked with them, that I will have sown seeds of hope, joy and encouragement that will bear fruit as they blossom

and flourish into adulthood.

My love story with God, for me, began when I was a young, troubled child, bullied constantly for my flaming curls of red hair. I always felt different, ugly and never good enough alongside my peers. Yet, I loved going for walks in the countryside with my Father and saw God's Handiwork everywhere I looked. I always knew deep down inside that I was not only loved by my dear Parents, but by God Himself in a very true and special way.

I left home in my teens and married my Soulmate, and we became proud Parents to two amazing Sons. Sadly, however, my Husband died of a terminal illness when I and my Children were still quite young. For many years I submerged myself into work, losing sight of how much God was there for all of us in our tragedy. Yet, I never lost my faith and when, many years later, with my sons both grown up, and with Families of their own, I went to work at sea with children onboard Cruise Ships. God made sure I knew He was there and called me out of my sadness and into training for Ministry to become the Priest I am today. In fact, me and my Precious Saviour have never been closer! He is the Light and Love of my life and I thank Him every day for my amazing Family, my Sons, their Wives and five Grandchildren, my special Friends and now this beautiful Parish to belong to! For me to live is Christ and to live life in all its fulness to His praise and Glory! I cannot wait to get to know everyone better and become involved in the life and soul of the Church!

A regular reader at church and recently she has jointly taken services. In those services Sandra did a short talk, reflecting on one of her weekly Christian readings. Her faith must have been a great comfort to her during her brief terminal illness, which in true Sandra style was kept private.

Mrs Kathleen Coupland Died 2nd November aged 92 years

Kath was born in 1932 in South Cave and was the eldest of 10 having 4 brothers and 5 sisters. She came to Broomfleet when she married Pete in 1952, her beloved sweetheart. Pete worked at Church Farm and Kath was the first to help out when it came to riddling spuds, picking peas or hoeing sugar beet. Kath became very engaged in village life, being involved with the Village Sports, Village Hall and the Church. She would organise events for the community including fancy dress competitions. Sue, Carole and Julie were always dressed up, dressing them as Nurses, Clowns, The Flower Pot Men (Bill Ben and Little Weed), the girls nearly always won a prize.

Kath also helped her friend Pat Gordon behind the bar in The Red Lion and scored for the darts team.

We will all remember Kath for her knitting. She knitted a King and Queen for Royal Celebrations at the Village Hall, a Nativity scene for Broomfleet Church, Post Box Toppers, Poppies for Remembrance Day and Knitted Toys which were raffled to raise money for Help The Heroes and Dove House, two Charities close to her heart.

Kath was the epitome of traditional village life in Broomfleet and is remembered fondly by many members of the community. Lord Bless and Keep her.
